THE CHARLES ASKIN PAPERS

Two years ago when a paving company threatened part of the site of the "Battle of Beaverdams", Esther Summers enlisted Branch members Dennis Gannon and Brenda Young to help search for documentation to prove that the Battle took place on the property.

Lots in Stamford and Thorold were searched to prove who owned the properties at the time of the Battle and trips to the Ontario Archives and National Archives of Canada (NAC) found many interesting documents.

Many primary source documents turned up that historians had either overlooked or not found.

NAC holds the private papers of Charles Askin a captain of the 2nd Regiment of the Lincoln Militia. He was the son of John Askin. Many of you may have researched in the papers of John Askin which are published in a two volume set.

Unfortunately Charles' papers are not microfilmed and are in very fragile condition. The originals are available at NAC where we were able to view them. Luckily for us that NAC would make photo copies.
